8:00 AM All Exhibitors Show Barn Clean Up. (General Rule #2) Each exhibitor of a market animal making the premium sale or a representative must be present and sign in at clean up conclusion with association President/designee or be assessed a fee of \$100.00.

General Rules & Regulations

All rules apply to all exhibitors and parents or guardians of exhibitors and Queen and Princess Contestants.

1. These rules apply to all departments and should be read by every exhibitor, Queen, and Princess Contestants. The association reserves the right to construe its own rules and regulations and to determine arbitrarily all matters and differences in regard thereto. After the Rules meeting each year in which the rules are reviewed and updated there may be no changes until the next year's rules meeting. Rules are to be followed with no deviations or exceptions. Failure to follow the rules of this show may result in forfeiture of all awards and monies and disqualification from this and/or future shows.

2. Each exhibitor of a market animal making the premium sale or a representative (*a representative may sign for only ONE exhibitor*) must be present and sign in at clean up conclusion on April 8, 2017, with association President/designee or be assessed a fee of \$100.00.

3. All exhibitors must be a bonafide FFA, Jr. FFA or 4-H member in good standing at the time of validation and through the show and sale; supervised by an Agriscience Teacher or Extension Agent; may not have graduated from High School or received their GED.

4. All entries in the Lamar County Junior Livestock Show are limited to Lamar County FFA and 4-H members who live in Lamar County, attend or live in one of the five (5) Lamar County School Districts (Paris, North Lamar, Chisum, Roxton, or Prairiland). LCJLS market animal exhibitors who have validated or sold a market animal at another county junior market show during the past 12 months will not be allowed to show or sell a market animal in the 2017 LCJLS. Closed Show, EXCEPTION: Heifer and Horse Shows open to Texas FFA & 4-H members.

5. All livestock must be owned by the exhibitor at the beginning of and throughout the feeding period. They must be under the daily care of and trained, fitted or dressed for show by the junior exhibitor under the direction and assistance from parents, siblings, grandparents or legal guardians; CEA's, VAT's, other junior exhibitors, or 4H leaders in Lamar County. Ownership of the market animals must be verified by superintendents, on scheduled validation dates. See schedule. All animals that require tags will be tagged at this time, any validation tag that is lost after this date must be reported as soon as possible to the superintendant in charge and the teacher or agent and junior livestock president. Animals entered in and having a major show tag need only bring LCJL entry form, the animal does not need to be at validation. The animal does need to be in the possession of the exhibitor who validated the

animal in the major show. A copy of major show validation must be turned in with LCJL entry. Each exhibitor and parent must sign stating they have received a rule book. Each exhibitor and his or her immediate family member(s), parent(s), guardian(s), and/or representative agree that in exchange for participation in the junior livestock show they will allow Lamar County Junior Livestock Show Association representatives as directed by the association president permission to enter unannounced onto the property where the exhibitor's project is located for purposes of inspection.

6. Before weighing in all market animals must be sheared, shaved, or clipped, clean and wearing no covering of any kind. Superintendents of each division will make that decision, if or when necessary.

7. NO PASS, NO CHECK IN, NO SHOW, NO SALE, NO FLOOR - A FFA or 4-H exhibitor or contestant in all divisions must be passing all classes in order to participate in the show from time of contest and including show and sale, *according to UIL rules*. (Any ineligible exhibitor's animal and/or project is also ineligible to show.)

8. The Lamar County Jr. Livestock Show Association, Red River Valley Fair Association, the Paris Rodeo and Horse Club, or The City of Paris will not be held liable for any damages, fire, theft, accidents, etc. to anyone.

9. Lamar County Junior Livestock Show holds the rights to drug test any animal upon reasonable suspicion. If animal tests positive exhibitor will be responsible for all fees, forfeit all awards, and will be banned. No sick animals will be allowed.

10. The decision of the awarding judge shall be final and no appeal shall be considered except upon the request of the Division Superintendent. Any one who shows disrespect for or attempts to interfere with judges, directors, or show officials during their duties shall be promptly excluded from competition. Lamar County Jr Livestock Show holds the right to ban/remove from show grounds ANYONE that is using language and/or conduct, deemed inappropriate. No adults will be allowed in the show ring except judges, clerks, and superintendents.

11. All livestock rules and regulation will be interpreted and enforced by the Livestock Division Superintendent. An appeal of the Division Superintendents decision may be made to the Sift committee by putting up \$200.00 cash deposit for the appeal fee. The appeal for any complaint must be written, plainly stating the reason for the appeal. The written appeal and cash deposit must be delivered to the Sift committee, within one hour from the conclusion of the show division to be appealed. Decision of the Sift Committee is final. Appeals not upheld by the Sift committee will forfeit the appeal fee of \$200.00. Judges decisions are not subject to appeal.

12. Any exhibitor, teacher, agent, parent etc. that uses artificial fill or pumping (drenching allowed with a drenching gun) on the fair grounds on any animal (market or breeding) will be disqualified and barred from the show and sale.

13. An exhibitor may not use an electronic device while actively engaged in any competition, exhibition of livestock, Ag Mechanics Show, etc.

14. No agents, solicitors, advertisers, or salesman of any description will be allowed on the grounds to conduct business except by written permission from the Association President.

15. All concession rights have been reserved by the Lamar County Jr. Livestock Show Association. Please support our Concession Stand.

16. NO ONE WILL BE ALLOWED TO SPEND THE NIGHT IN THE BARN.

17. Tie space and pens in the cattle barn will be assigned by the division Superintendents. All stalls will be rotated annually.

18. Exhibitors may display FFA or 4-H signs over their animals.

19. Awards will be awarded to all Champion and Reserve Champion winners. Ribbons will be awarded to all entries in the show.

20. Lamar County animals will not be released until they check with their Superintendent. After this time these exhibitors must not solicit money from the premium buyers on the fair grounds.

21. Removal of an exhibit before release time will result in forfeiture of all awards received unless you get permission from that division's superintendent.

22. Trailers will not be permitted around the Livestock barn. They must be taken to assigned area(s) after animals are unloaded.

23. No parking will be permitted on the West side of the street in the Livestock Barn area.

24. Jr. Showmanship will be for 13 years and under. Sr. Showmanship will be for 14 years and older. Class sizes will be determined by superintendents. Any student that shows in a Showmanship class must own the animal shown. No substitute showman may participate.

25. All exhibitors must, weigh-in, show and sell their own animal and/or project using a substitute only if two animals fall in the same class, or the exhibitor is competing in a UIL event, has a death in the family, illness or medical condition. The exhibitor must notify the appropriate superintendent. A substitute exhibitor must be an eligible and entered exhibitor of the 2016 LCJLS.

26. An exhibitor that has more than one species qualifying for the market sale MUST inform the superintendents which animal they are selling AS SOON AS their last animal is shown. (**See market animal sale rule 4&5**)

27. Exhibitors MUST tell the superintendent at weigh-in, April 6, 2016, what the disposition of each animal will be if it does not make the sale (home, floor, etc.). This disposition can only be changed by telling the superintendent by 9:00 PM Thursday.

28. Animal wastes must be placed in the dumpster(s) in the designated waste area(s); NOT IN THE TRASH CANS!

29. The sift committee consists of five (5) board members, or volunteers appointed by the president.

30. Exhibitors may only show the same market animal one time at the Lamar County Junior Livestock Show.

Queens Contest

Contest Coordinator - Patsy Smith, **Assistant Coordinator** - Joyce Middleton

1. Queen Contestants 9th grade and up
2. Jr Queen Contestants 6th - 8th grades
3. Princess Contestants 3rd - 5th grades
4. Must be a member of the club or chapter they enter under, by January 1, of the year they are a contestant. Each club may have more than one contestant in each division.
5. To be a contestant they must be entered or have exhibited an animal in the LCJL Show.
6. Casual dress for the contest - jeans or dresses.
7. Contest will be set at a convenient time for all involved.
8. Once a contestant has won in an age group they may not compete in that age group again. However, a person who won princesses may enter the queen's contest when they are old enough.
9. Resume form must be completed and turned in to the contest coordinator on the designated date on the form.

Commercial Broilers

Superintendents - Ty Merritt ,Steve Tucker, Margariet Simpson

1. General rules of the show apply to this division.
2. Entry fee is non-refundable \$30.00 per pen of broilers, due at validation.
3. One pen of three (3), any sex or combination.
4. All birds must be ordered and paid for (cash only) on the scheduled validation date. See validation schedule. Exhibitors eligible for this show must have had their names submitted by broiler show Superintendent for pullorum certification at the time the chicks are received. No substitutions are allowed.
5. All birds MUST be removed from the Coliseum by 11:00am on the day of the show. All birds remaining after 11:00am become the property of the Lamar County Junior Livestock Show and will be disposed of.

Rabbit Fryers

Superintendents - Thea Eubanks

1. General rules of the show apply to this division.
2. Entry fee is non-refundable \$30.00 per pen of fryers, due according to validation schedule.
3. Exhibitor may raise their bunnies from their own Doe, or buy bunnies. Entries must be turned in according to the validation schedule.
4. Fryer rabbits must not weigh under 3 lbs. and not over 5 lbs. per rabbit.
5. Pens and litter will be furnished.
6. **Items that will bring about sifting** are as follows:
 - Rabbits other than, New Zealand, Californian, or other meat breeds of Rabbits
 - Sniffles or colds

- Buck or butting teeth
- Sore hocks
- Weight under 3 lbs. and over 5 lbs. per rabbit
- Ear canker
- Scours

If any rabbit is disqualified, the whole pen will be disqualified.

7. Rabbits not making the sale should be picked up as soon as judging of the fryer rabbits are over. Rabbits not picked up will be sold with the proceeds going to the Lamar County Junior Livestock Show.

Market Lambs

Superintendents -Phyllis Brumley, Margariet Simpson, Steve Tucker

1. General rules of the show apply.
2. Lambs must be owned by exhibitor & validated on the scheduled validation date. See validation schedule.
3. Entry fee is non-refundable \$30.00 per head, due at validation.
4. Items that will bring immediate sifting are as follows:
 - Weighing less than 100 pounds
 - Weighing more than 170 pounds
 - Uncontrollable animal
 - Obviously inferior quality animal

5. Only lambs sifted due to weight will have one chance to re-weigh.
6. All market lambs will be tagged according to USDA scrapies requirements.
7. Must be slick sheared at weigh-in. This includes all wool above the knee
8. Lambs will be allowed to bed on pine shavings only.
9. **CLASSES:**

-Market lambs will be divided into classes determined after the weigh-in by the Sheep Superintendent at his/her discretion. There will be no more than 15 animals in a class if possible.

-Grand Champion Market Lamb

-Reserve Champion Market Lamb

-Junior Sheep Showmanship 13 years old and under

-Senior Sheep Showmanship 14 years old and over

Market Hogs

Superintendents - Tel Pitcock, Patt Swaim

1. General rules of the show apply to this division.
2. Market Hogs must be owned by the exhibitor and validated on the scheduled validation date. See validation schedule.
3. Entry fee is non-refundable \$30.00 per head, due at validation.
4. Minimum weight is 235 pounds, maximum weight is 280. Only hogs sifted due to weight will have one chance to re-weigh.
5. Items that will bring out immediate sifting are as follows:
 - Weight less than 235 pounds or more than 280 pounds
 - Uncontrollable animal
 - Obviously inferior quality animal
6. Hogs will be allowed to bed on pine shavings only.
7. **Classes:**

-Market hogs will be divided into classes determined after the weigh-in by the Swine Superintendent at his/her discretion. There will be no more than 15 animals per class if possible.

-Grand Champion Market Hog

-Reserve Champion Market Hog

-Junior Swine Showmanship 13 years old and under

-Senior Swine Showmanship 14 years old and over

Steer Division

Superintendents - Steve Monkres, Matt Preston

1. General rules of the show apply to this division.
2. All steer hair will be clipped to one-fourth (1/4) inch in length on all body parts except the twitch. Animals will be checked at weigh-in. If not meeting the 1/4" rule they will be sent back to re-clip before weighing.
3. Entry fee is non-refundable \$30.00, due at validation.
4. All steers must be owned and validated on the scheduled validation date. See validation schedule.
5. Minimum weight is 1,000 pounds. Only steers sifted due to weight will have one chance to re-weigh.
6. Classes will be determined by the Superintendent at his/her discretion.
7. A sifting committee will be appointed for the purpose of excluding any undesirable animal from show competition. Items which will bring about immediate sifting are:
 - Weight less than 1,000 lbs.
 - Horned steer calves
 - Uncontrollable animals - See general rules
 - Obviously inferior quality animal
8. All steers must be bedded on *pine shavings only*.

9. There will be a Plaque given to the Breeder of the Highest Placing Steer bred and raised in Lamar County.

10. **CLASSES:**

-The classes will be determined by the steer superintendents after the official weigh-in.

-Grand Champion Steer

-Reserve Champion Steer

-Junior Steer Showmanship 13 years old and under

-Senior Steer Showmanship 14 years old and over

Market Goat Show

Superintendents: Tom VanDerSchaaf, Rick Zant

1. General rules of the show apply to this division.

2. Market Goats must be owned by the exhibitor and validated on the scheduled validation date. See validation schedule.

3. Entry fee is non-refundable \$30.00 per head, due at validation.

4. Market Goat classes are opened to any wether or doe kids of any breed or crossbreed.

5. Minimal weight is 50 pounds with maximum 130 lbs.

6. Market goats must have tipped horns prior to the arrival to the show grounds. Horn measurement at tip will be no less than 1/2 inch across.

7. Items that will bring about immediate sifting are as follows:

-weight less than 50 lbs or more than 130 lbs.

-removal or tipping of horns on show grounds

-uncontrollable animal

-obviously inferior quality animal

8. All Market Goats must be tagged according to USDA scrapies requirements.

9. Exhibitors will be required to shear their animals with hair no longer than 3/8" at weigh-in.
10. Exhibitors will be allowed to use halters, collars, and/or leads in the show ring.
11. Sifted animals will not be allowed for floor sale.

Classes:

- Market goats will be divided into classes determined after the weigh-in by the goat superintendents by their discretion.
- Grand Champion Market Goat
- Reserve Champion Market Goat
- Junior Goat Showmanship 13 years old and under
- Senior Goat Showmanship 14 years old and over

Breeding Beef Heifers

Superintendents - Josh Stapleton, Jennifer Clark

1. General rules of the show apply to this division.
2. Entry fee non-refundable is \$30.00 per head **CASH ONLY**.
3. Show in 3 divisions by alphabetical order. One head constitutes a breed.
4. Registered females may show in breed class and commercial in A.O.B. class.
5. All animals will be awarded placing ribbons.
6. Breeding cattle must be bedded on *pine shavings only*.
7. All uncontrollable animals will be excused.
8. Blow and show only.

9. **BREEDING BEEF HEIFER CLASSES:**

Class 1 - Born on or after 9-1-2016

Class 2 - Born 5-1-2016 to 8-31-2016

Class 3 - Born 1-1-2016 to 4-31-2016

Parade of Future Exhibitors

Superintendents - *Kelly Stapleton, Phyllis Brumley*

1. The child must be between 3 years of age and 2nd grade and to able stay in the ring unattended.
2. Entry fee is \$10.00 per animal and entry may be made 30 minutes before the class at the Livestock office. Exhibitor MUST have exhibitor number.
3. All animals that have been shown in the market show will show in a separate class.
4. No animal that is taller than the exhibitor will be shown, if the animal seems to be uncontrolled it will be tied to the fence or ask to leave.

5. No dogs, cats, horses, mules, burros, donkeys or llamas will be allowed.
6. Kids must stay in the ring until conclusion of the show.
7. Only directors, superintendents, queen and princess nominees and clerks will assist.

Jackpot Horse Show

Jackpot Superintendent: Adam Golden, Jeff Reed

Entry fee will be determined for Jackpot events upon number of entries.

Classes: Barrels (All Ages)
 Poles (All Ages)
 Team Roping (enter twice)
 Calf Roping (All Ages)
 BreakAway Roping (All Ages)

Agricultural Mechanics Contest

Superintendents - Wes Brown, Clint Hildreth

1. General rules of the show apply to this division.
2. Students may enter as individuals, partners (two or more students), or as part of a chapter entry. Chapter entries will count toward Chapter Sweepstakes Awards.
3. There will be no limit on chapter or club projects. An entry form and entry fee of \$30.00, non-refundable, will be charged for each project in the show and is due according to validation schedule.
4. Documentation: An original plan or drawing, bill of materials (entry fee should be added to the cost of the project), photographs showing all phases of construction.
5. Projects must be in place by Thursday, April 6, 2017.
6. Projects will be judged at 8:30 a.m. Friday, April 7, 2017.

7. Ag Mechanics projects must be removed from the fairgrounds by 10:00 p.m. Friday, April 7, 2017.

8. Exhibitors must be present during judging and available to answer questions from the judge about the construction and/or function of the project. Exhibitors not present at the time of judging will be disqualified.

9. Judging of projects will be based on:

- a. Workmanship (250 pts)
- b. Complexity (75 pts)
- c. Presentation (75 pts)

- d. Knowledge of the Project by the student (100 pts)
- e. Soundness, Structure, Design, and Balance (100 pts)
- f. Originality (100 pts)
- g. Finish (100 pts)
- h. Documentation (200 pts) **Total = 1000 points**

10. The Ag Mechanics Show will consist of 2 divisions:

1. Metal
2. Wood

Possible Classes:

Superintendent will classify projects on complexity!

- I. Furniture/Crafts (lamps, desks, tables, picnic tables, lawn chairs, etc.)
- II. Farm Equipment (fencing equipment, tractor equipment, etc.)
- III. Trailers (bumper pull, gooseneck, and anything with axle)
- IV. Recreational Equipment (smokers, deer stands, deer feeders, etc.)

a V. Shop Equipment

11. There will be an Overall Champion and Reserve Champion Project for the Ag Mechanics Project Show.

12. There will be an organizational sweepstakes award given to the organization with the highest total points per organization. Individuals, partnerships, and chapter/club entries will count towards the sweepstakes award, An organization is considered to be either an FFA chapter or a 4-H Club. Point per entry will be totaled for each organization. The organization with the highest total points will be awarded a plaque. Points will be as follows:

- a. 1st place in class = 5 pts.
- b. 2nd place in class = 3 pts.
- c. 3rd place in class = 1 pt.

- d. Grand Champion within a division = 7 pts.
- e. Reserve Champion within a division = 6 pts.

13. Prefabricated or Kit Projects will not be permitted.

14. All exhibitors are required to build, fabricate, paint (if required), and etc. all facets of the project. Exhibitors may receive assistance but the exhibitor is required to complete all building tasks. Failure in this rule will result in a deduction of points or possible disqualification.

15. Lamar County Junior Livestock Show will not be responsible for projects in case of loss or damage.

16. Any deviation from these rules will require action from the Livestock Show Executive Board.

1. The Market Animal Sale will include up to 115 lots determined as follows: maximum of 25 steers, 33% of rabbit exhibitors up to 10 maximum, 33% of broiler exhibitors up to 10 maximum. Maximum of 35 sale lots per species.

2. **SALE ORDER:** All Grand Champions (Steer, Hog, Lamb, Rabbit, Broiler, Goat). Followed by all Reserve Champions (Steer, Hog, Lamb, Rabbit, Broiler, Goat). The order of species will rotate annually. All 1st place animals of each species in each class will sell then 2nd, 3rd, etc.

3. Exhibitors may sell only one lot in the sale.

4. Champion and Reserve Champions from each division must sell, not to exceed the one animal per exhibitor rule. If any exhibitor exhibits both Grand Champion and Reserve Champion within the same species, the Grand will sell and the judge will determine who sells in the remaining spots. The original Reserve Champion will retain awards. If an exhibitor has two champions in different species, the highest placing champion will sell. If these two placed the same, the exhibitor will choose which animal will sell. Sale lots will move up one place in the species that had a champion removed from the sale.

5. If an exhibitor places more than one animal in the sale within a species, the highest placing animal will sell. When animals are removed from the sale order, lower placing animals will be moved up in the sale order.

6. If an exhibitor has placed more than one entry in different species in the sale (steer, hog, lamb, goat, pen of broilers, or fryer rabbits) the exhibitor must choose the entry to be sold and notify each division superintendent of that decision. This decision must be made and the superintendents notified by the conclusion of the steer show.
7. Sale animals will be sold on weigh-in weight. No shrink will be used.
8. There will be no sales of non-sale animals after the 8:00 PM Thursday departure deadline.
9. To defray the costs of advertising, photographs, and the buyers meal, each sale lot will be assessed a sales fee of \$50.00 per lot. The fee will be determined annually by the board.
10. Exhibitors will receive sale checks after all payments for sale animals have been received and after a thank you note and framed picture have been delivered to the buyer.
11. Any animal sent to resale cannot be taken off the truck or switched for another animal. The buyer/floor buyer has the option to change his/her mind until the sale is completed in the office.
12. Exhibitors/parent/guardian are not permitted to ask the buyer for their animal back. If this occurs the exhibitor will be disqualified from future shows.
